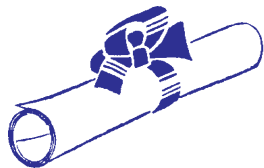

The best of luck to all graduating seniors that apply for these scholarships.

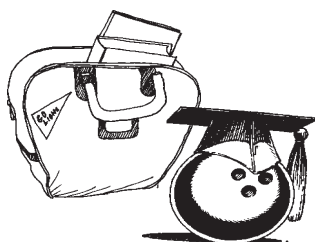

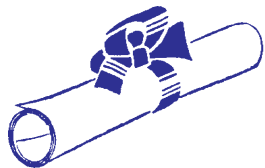

At the last meeting of the Iowa Bowling Council, April 10, 2010 forty one (41) - \$300.00 scholarships were awarded to Iowa high school seniors.

Iowa Bowling Council President, Bruce Strom said "Since the inception of the Iowa Bowling Council in 1985, the Council has awarded 450 scholarships dispersing in excess of \$135,000.00."

Scholarship awards are based on a point system: up to 10 points for the application; up to 15 points for the applicant's essay; up to 10 points for the coach's evaluation and data sheet; and up to 15 points for the school official or counselor's evaluation and data sheet.

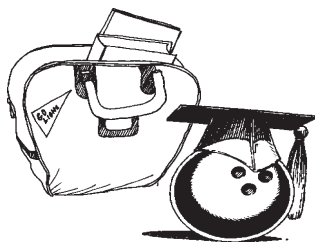

IOWA BOWLING COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

INSTRUCTION TO APPLICANT

ELIGIBILITY RULES

Any graduating high school senior is eligible to receive a scholarship, providing the student meets the following requirements:

A. Must be a current member of the USBC Youth and be in good standing for the current season. Must have been a YABA/USBC member Grades 9 thru 12. (Exceptions will be considered on an individual basis.)

B. Files an application furnished by the Scholarship Fund Committee, giving complete information as required thereon, After October 31, 2010 & no later than February 15, 2011. Application is to be filed with: Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association; 2518 Clarkson Avenue; Des Moines, IA 50310.

C. Has unimpaired amateur standing in the sport of bowling.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Step #1 - Fill out page number 1 entirely.

Step #2 - Applicant must write and sign an essay of no more than 150 words on "What Has Youth Bowling Meant To Me" such as: My personal growth thru youth membership or Experiences I've gained through youth bowling. and sign your name.

Step #3 - Give your league coach your essay, pages 1 and 2 of the application form and a stamped envelope addressed to Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association. Ask the coach to fill out page 2 entirely. The coach should then mail the essay and pages 1 and 2 to the Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association by February 15, 2011.

Step #4 - Give page 3 to a school official or your school counselor along with a stamped envelope addressed to Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association. Ask the school official or counselor to fill out page 3 and mail it by February 15, 2011.

Step #5 - Check with your league coach and school official or counselor by February 1st to make sure all the application papers have been mailed. Thank them for their help and cooperation.

POLICIES

A. Scholarship funds may be utilized, after graduation from high school, for educational purposes at an accredited university, college OR for training at approved trade schools, business schools, beauty schools, etc.

B. Scholarship funds will be held in an escrow account until applicant is enrolled in an institution. Scholarship funds may be utilized for tuition, room, board or books.

C. Scholarship funds must be utilized completely within 18 months from date of award. Any funds remaining after this time period will revert to the general scholarship fund.

D. Since 1987 the Iowa Bowling Council has awarded 450 scholarships dispersing in excess of \$135,000 in scholarships. In 2010, forty one (41) \$300.00 scholarships were awarded.

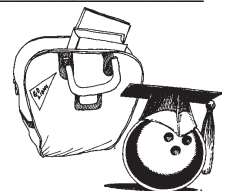

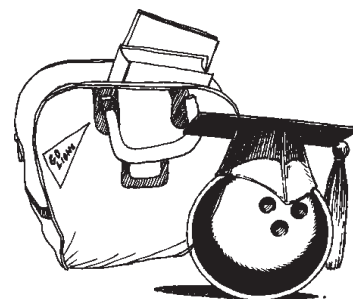


